4. Students in Palmetto College are required to demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to the 122 course through course credit or the corresponding foreign language placement score.
5. ECON 224 may substitute for ECON 221 and ECON 222, in which case another approved elective will be needed to meet hours to graduate.
6. The Arts and Sciences electives must include two disciplines.
7. Integrative Major Courses: Select 33 credits from the following lists, with at least 9 credits from each of the three categories, and at least 12 credits at the 400 level. No more than 15 hours combined from MGMT, ACCT, and ECON may be selected. Please check the Bulletin for required prerequisites.
