Graduate Certificates

LLC-MA (Spanish concentration) and PhD in Spanish: literary and cultural studies

Our graduate programs allow students to conduct research in Spanish and Latin American literary and cultural studies and offer connections with issues in Comparative Literature, Transatlantic Studies, Film Studies and other related fields



LLC-MA (Spanish concentration) and PhD in Spanish: literary and cultural studies (cont.)

- For MA, may pursue a subconcentration in Hispanic Linguistics
- Concurrent PhD in <u>Comparative Literature</u> or <u>Linguistics</u> (with possible minor specialization in <u>Hispanic Studies</u>)

Spanish American literature, 16th-19th centuries, literature and visual arts, race and cultural difference in Spanish America, post-colonial literatures in the Andes, food studies, disgust studies, senses and emotions in Latin America

Contemporary Latin American literary and cultural studies, Brazil, Southern Cone, postdictatorship, critical theory, visual culture, urban studies, ecological cultural studies in Latin America

Degree Requirements

MA (thesis and non-thesis tracks):

33 hours of approved coursework and other requirements (comprehensive exam, foreign language)

PhD

66 hours post-BA (at most 30 from MA), with 24 hours of approved coursework, dissertation (12 hours) and other requirements (candidacy process, comprehensive exam, foreign language)

Application Deadline

For applicants wishing to be considered for Assistantships and other financial support, all application materials must be received by the Graduate School by January 1

 After May 1, students will be considered only if space is available, or for the following year

Admissions Procedures

- For the MA, applicants must hold a BA degree in Spanish or related field of study with significant coursework in Spanish
- For the PhD, applicants typically hold an MA degree in Spanish or related field of study
 - Direct admission post-BA may be possible
- Graduates of foreign university programs where Spanish is the official language should consult the graduate advisor



Admissions, cont.

For all applicants:

- Minimum overall GPA of 3.0/4.0
- Three (academic) letters of recommendation from previous Spanish instructors
- GRE scores (optional) (500/153 on Verbal and 4.0 on Analytical Writing)
 - (For non-native English speakers 400/146, 3.5; also TOEFL, minimum 80 on the iBT)



Other application materials

- **Statement of purpose** (~1-2 pp.) written in English describing previous academic work related to Spanish, relevant practical experience, intended specialization or research interest, career goals
- Academic writing sample (~2,500 words, written in Spanish)
 - (in English for those students whose native language is Spanish)
- Five-minute sample of spoken Spanish
 - (in English for those students whose native language is Spanish)
- International applicants will need to submit additional documentation and satisfy English proficiency requirements. See here.



Financial Support

Graduate assistantships (basis of merit)

- 2 years for MA, 4 for PhD
- Training to teach language courses
- May assist with other duties
 - Foreign Language Learning Center, tutoring and leading extracurricular activities for undergraduate students
- Tuition abatement (6-9 hours/semester is full time)
- Stipend (depending on status)
 - (AY 2023-2024: Year 1, \$15,000+\$1,500 scholarship;
 Years 2-4, \$17,000+\$2,000 scholarship)
